

CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Dear valued customer, You have just become the owner of a unique piece of furniture that has been handmade by talented artisans. Take care of it to keep the elegance and charm of the unique finishing with the below suggestions for care.

Please read carefully the below on how to maintain your handmade carefully crafted furniture to enjoy and admire for many years to come.

CHARACTERISTICS OF SOLID LACQUERED WOOD

This range is predominantly made up of solid bayur, mahogany and mindi veneer. These woods have anti-fungal properties and is resistant to decay. Due to their hardwood properties & unique light color they are a perfect blend to create that unique piece of furniture with its own distinct character and charm.

To maintain your furniture, you'll need to protect it from extreme temperature swings, moisture sun, and heat. By caring for it in the right manner, you will prolong its excellence.

CARE OF FURNITURE

- Regular light dusting with a fine cloth will serve most of the time.
- When needed, use a lightly dampened cloth to lift dirt, then lightly buff with a fine, dry cloth.
- Any spillages should be cleaned up as soon as possible, then wiped with a clean, damp cloth to lift any sticky residue, then dry with a fine cloth. You may also want to polish the surface to renew the lustre if required.
- Arrange your furniture away from sources of heat such as radiators, fireplaces, etc. Don't put your furniture in direct sunlight, as this will eventually bleach the exterior. If you have ornaments placed on the surface of your furniture, make sure to move them regularly into a different position to avoid discoloration on the surface.
- Always use place mats and coasters, to prevent scratching, heat rings and water marks. There are products available that can help correct these types of damage, should they occur.
- Nail polish remover along with similar products should always be kept well away from your furniture, as damage from these products will require professional repair.
- If you're arranging furniture on a hard floor, you may wish to consider fitting felt pads to the parts that have contact with the floor, to minimize scratches.
- Upholstered Care: Treat spills and stains as soon as possible by gently blotting with a damp, clean cloth. Do not scrub as this can alter the fabric appearance.
- Gently vacuum the upholstery to remove and dust or lint.
